The State Rehabilitation Council (SRC) is a group of people who work to make Vocational Rehabilitation (VR) better. It is separate from VR.

The SRC listens to VR participants about their VR experience. The SRC also works with VR to improve services for people with disabilities who are looking for work.

— Council structure

Council members bring diverse experiences. They represent the following areas:

- ◆ Organizations and agencies that work with people with disabilities
- ◆ People who are receiving or have received VR Services
- ◆ Advocates for people with disabilities
- ◆ Business owners
- ◆ Tribal VR
- ◆ Statewide Independent Living Council

The council also includes two non-voting members from VR: a VR counselor and the director. They provide information about VR but do not make decisions for the council.

- ◆ Participate in a listening session hosted by the SRC.
- ◆ Complete the Consumer Satisfaction Survey.
- ◆ Go to a quarterly SRC meeting. Meetings are held around the state and online. You can attend in person or from your phone or computer.

Your VR counselor will invite you to participate in all of these opportunities. If you have questions, ask your counselor.
