The Oregon Health Plan (OHP) covers everything children and teens need to stay in school and thrive

- With OHP, children and teens get the health care they need to fully take part in classroom and after-school activities. For example, OHP covers vaccinations, check-ups, mental health counseling, eye exams, dental visits and other care.

Healthy children and teens have better educational results

- Common causes of chronic absenteeism are health issues such as:
 - » Respiratory illness
 - » Dental pain
 - » Mental health conditions
- Reducing absenteeism leads to children and teens staying in school and having better educational results such as:
 - » Better test scores
 - » Better graduation rates

Mental health is a major issue for children and teens in Oregon

- OHP covers a wide range of mental and behavioral health services including:
 - » Counseling or therapy
 - » Emergency services
 - » Evaluations and consultations
 - » Hospital stays
 - » Medication
 - » Medication management
 - » Peer-delivered services
 - » Residential treatment
 - » Help with addiction to tobacco, alcohol and drugs
 - » Care coordination



Oregon’s health care priority: 100% of children and teens have access to health coverage

- As of 2018, more children and teens in Oregon qualify for OHP, regardless of immigration status.
- For the first time in a decade, Medicaid and Children’s Health Insurance Program (CHIP) enrollment among children and teens nationally is declining.

Disparities in health coverage rates persist among students in Oregon

- Many students, including those in middle-income households, qualify for the Oregon Health Plan (OHP) but may not know it.
- Oregon has a 4.6 percent overall uninsured rate. However, 15 percent of Latinos in our state are uninsured.
- Thanks to Cover All Kids, an estimated 15,000 children and teens regardless of immigration status now qualify for OHP. However, only a third are enrolled.

Oregon Health Authority’s Community Partner Outreach Program (CPOP) is here to help.

We know you are busy, so we’ve made it easy.

- Our statewide network of OHP-certified community partners is ready to help your students and their families get the health coverage they need.
- Services are free, available in multiple languages and include:
 - » Onsite enrollment help at your school
 - » Participation in school events
 - » OHP promotional and educational materials
 - » Community resource connections such as housing, energy help, food and more
 - » For those who may not qualify for OHP (e.g., are over income) help connecting to other health coverage options. For example, private health insurance and financial help through Oregon’s Health Insurance Marketplace.
