100% Project: Partner with Us to Ensure All Children and Teens in Oregon Have Access to Health Coverage and the Health Care Services They Need to Thrive!

Oregon's health care priority: 100% of children and teens have access to health coverage

- Thanks to Cover All Kids, as of 2018, all children and teens in Oregon who are younger than 19 and meet income and other criteria can qualify for OHP regardless of immigration status.
 - » Children and teens in families that earn up to 305 percent of the federal poverty level qualify. As an example, in 2019, a family of four that earns up to \$6,545 a month qualifies.
- For the first time in a decade, Medicaid and Children's Health Insurance Program (CHIP) enrollment among children and teens nationally is declining.

Disparities in health coverage rates persist

- Oregon has a 4.6 percent overall uninsured rate. However, 15% of Latinos in our state remain uninsured.

Many of your pediatric uninsured patients now qualify for OHP but may not know it

- 2018 OCHIN Epic data shows that children and teens continue to receive safety net clinic services. However, some remain uninsured.
- An estimated 15,000 children and teens qualify for Cover All Kids, but only a third are enrolled.

 - » Support with outreach to uninsured patients.
 - » Connection to our statewide network of OHP-certified community partners who can help with enrollment.
