

The Oregon Health Plan Covers COVID-19 and Flu Vaccines for Children, Youth, and Families



Kids 5 and older can now get the COVID-19 vaccine and booster dose.

Kids ages 5 and older can now get a primary COVID-19 vaccine series and the updated (bivalent) COVID-19 booster dose. [Read more about available COVID-19 vaccines for kids.](#)

The Oregon Health Plan (OHP) covers the COVID-19 and flu vaccines for OHP and CWM members.

- OHP adults and children can get both shots at the same time, or at separate visits.
- CWM members must get both shots at the same visit. The flu vaccine is only covered when received at the same visit as the COVID-19 vaccine.

COVID-19 and flu vaccines are available through pharmacies, doctor's offices, community clinics, and hospitals.

The Oregon Health Authority strongly encourages everyone get both a COVID-19 and flu vaccine if they can.

- Children 6 months and older can get a flu shot. Parents and guardians should take children who are between 6 months and 2 years old to their child's doctor's office to get the flu vaccine.
- Youth 15 years and older do not need their parents' permission to get vaccinated.

Pharmacies can now provide children's COVID-19 and flu shots.

Parents and guardians can also take children to any pharmacy that accepts OHP or CWM coverage and is ready to provide vaccines to children.

- Children 3 and older may get the flu shot at the pharmacy.
- Children 5 and older may get the COVID-19 vaccine at the pharmacy.

Children 5 and older can get the COVID-19 and flu vaccines at the same time or at separate visits.

Plan ahead before taking kids to get COVID-19 and flu vaccines.

Find vaccine providers who accept OHP and are ready to provide flu and COVID-19 vaccines to younger children.

- If you plan to visit a pharmacy, contact the pharmacy to make sure they have both vaccines, can give your child the vaccines, and accept OHP.
- If your children have a primary care provider (PCP), ask the PCP about their vaccine options.
