

# Understanding Your COVID-19 Test Results

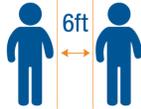
Today you received a test for SARS-CoV-2, the virus that causes COVID-19. This viral test, called a PCR test, uses a sample from your nose to see if there is virus in your body.

Within roughly a week, someone from public health will call you with your test results. Please do not call local or state public health for your test results as it may slow the notification process.

If you have symptoms of COVID-19

<p><b>+</b> Positive</p>	<p>You have COVID-19.</p>	<div style="display: flex; justify-content: space-around; align-items: center;"> <div style="text-align: center;">  <p>Stay home for at least 10 days since you felt ill and until 24 hours after you feel better and fever is gone.</p> </div> <div style="text-align: center;">  <p>Answer the phone when public health calls.</p> </div> <div style="text-align: center;">  <p>Call a health care provider if you feel ill.</p> </div> </div>
<p><b>-</b> Negative</p>	<p>You might have COVID-19. The test does not always detect the virus that causes COVID-19. A negative test does not mean that you are protected from disease.</p>	<div style="display: flex; justify-content: space-around; align-items: center;"> <div style="text-align: center;">  <p>Stay home until 24 hours after you feel better.<sup>1</sup></p> </div> <div style="text-align: center;">  <p>Answer the phone when public health calls.</p> </div> <div style="text-align: center;">  <p>Call a health care provider if you feel ill.</p> </div> </div>

<sup>1</sup> If you have had a significant exposure to a case of COVID-19, you will be considered a close contact of a person with COVID-19 and asked by public health to stay at home for 14 days regardless of negative results.

# If you do not have symptoms of COVID-19

<p><b>+</b> Positive</p>	<p>You have COVID-19. You might develop symptoms.</p>	<div style="display: flex; justify-content: space-around; align-items: flex-start;"> <div style="text-align: center;">  <p>Stay home for 10 days after your test.</p> </div> <div style="text-align: center;">  <p>Answer the phone when public health calls.</p> </div> <div style="text-align: center;">  <p>Call a health care provider if you feel ill.</p> </div> </div>
<p><b>-</b> Negative</p>	<p>You might have COVID-19. The test does not always detect the virus that causes COVID-19. A negative test does not mean that you are protected from disease.</p>	<div style="display: flex; flex-direction: column; align-items: center;"> <div style="display: flex; justify-content: space-around; width: 100%;"> <div style="text-align: center;">  <p>Stay at least six (6) feet away from people you do not live with.<sup>2</sup></p> </div> <div style="text-align: center;">  <p>Wear a face covering in public.</p> </div> <div style="text-align: center;">  <p>Wash your hands often.</p> </div> </div> <div style="display: flex; justify-content: space-around; align-items: flex-start; margin-top: 20px;"> <div style="text-align: center;">  <p>Cover coughs and sneezes.</p> </div> <div style="text-align: center;">  <p>Do not touch your face.</p> </div> <div style="text-align: center;">  <p>Call a health care provider if you feel ill.</p> </div> </div> </div>
