

What to know before you get vaccinated



Information about where to find a vaccine is available at covidvaccine.oregon.gov and through the [Get Vaccinated Oregon \(GVO\) tool](#).



No identification necessary. OHA does not require proof that you are eligible. Vaccine providers may require you to declare eligibility at a vaccination site.



You do not need to provide a Social Security number. Even if you are asked during the scheduling process, you can leave that field blank.



The COVID-19 vaccine will be free. You do not need health insurance, but if you are insured, bring your insurance card to your appointment.



Transportation options are available. If you are an Oregon Health Plan (OHP) member and need a ride to get a vaccine, rides are free. Find a ride through [OHP ride services](#) or through your Coordinated Care Organization (CCO) plan.



Don't go to your appointment if you are sick.



You may have to wait in line. Plan ahead and ask vaccine site administrators for language or other accommodations if you need them.



You will be observed for 15–30 minutes after vaccination. Your vaccine provider will want to make sure you're feeling okay.



If you receive a two-dose vaccine, you will need to schedule another appointment. If you receive either a Pfizer or Moderna vaccine, you should receive a vaccination card that tells you when to get your second dose. The Johnson & Johnson vaccine requires only one dose.



You must quarantine if you are exposed to COVID-19 before you receive your final dose. Follow public health guidelines and stay home for 14 days even if you've gotten your first shot.
