

Is a COVID-19 Vaccine Booster Recommended for Me?

All three vaccines are available as a booster dose for certain groups. People can get a booster dose at most locations that provide COVID-19 vaccines, depending on advice from their health care provider, preference, availability or convenience.



Yes if you received Johnson & Johnson at least two months ago and:

- Are age 18 or older



Strongly advised if you received Pfizer or Moderna at least six months ago and are:

- Age 65 or older
- 18 and older and a long-term care facility resident
- Age 50–64, with underlying medical conditions, increased risk of social inequities, or disabilities (including intellectual and developmental disabilities).



You may if you received Pfizer or Moderna at least six months ago, are age 18 or older and have:

- Underlying medical conditions, social inequities or disabilities (including intellectual and developmental disabilities)
- Increased exposure and transmission risk because of where you work or live
 - ◆ Examples include teachers, grocery store employees, health care workers and people working in congregate care settings.

Note: It is recommended that social determinants of vulnerability be included in the assessment of medical conditions that qualify individuals for booster doses.
