Arrival Screening Testing for Overnight Camps

Screening testing can identify COVID-19 in people who are asymptomatic or pre-symptomatic and reduce the risk of spread.

Screening Testing for Camp and Summer Programming Staff

Screening testing can identify COVID-19 in people who are asymptomatic or pre-symptomatic and reduce the risk of spread.

- All unvaccinated youth program staff may participate in free weekly screening testing. Staff are not required to disclose their vaccination status to participate.

Screening Testing for School-Affiliated Summer Programming Students

Screening testing can identify COVID-19 in people who are asymptomatic or pre-symptomatic and reduce the risk of spread.

- All unvaccinated Oregon K-12 students participating in summer school and school-affiliated programs (e.g., camps on school grounds, extracurricular activities affiliated with the school or district) may participate in free weekly screening testing. Students are not required to disclose their vaccination status to participate.
