

Your Right to Choose a DUII Services Provider

You have the right to:

1. Choose services and supports that respect and meet the needs of your language and culture;
2. Choose services and supports in a setting that gives you the freedom, independence, and community you need; and
3. Choose a *Division-approved* DUII services provider by yourself. People should not tell you how to choose your provider.

If you are on bench probation, supervised probation, or in treatment court:

Please check with your supervising officer before choosing a provider. You may need to see a specific provider.

Getting approval from your supervising officer is strongly encouraged. Do this **before** choosing a DUII services provider or asking to change to a new one.
